Who Should get the H1N1 Inactivated Influenza Vaccine, the “Flu Shot”?

1. Pregnant women
2. People who live with or care for infants younger than 6 months of age
3. Health care and emergency medical personnel
4. Anyone from 18 through 24 years of age
5. Anyone from 25 through 64 years of age with certain chronic medical conditions (such as asthma, diabetes, heart disease, or lung disease) or a weakened immune system caused by cancer, cancer treatment, HIV/AIDS or medicine.

As more vaccine becomes available, these groups should also be vaccinated:

1. Healthy 25 through 64 year olds
2. Adults 65 years and older

Who Should Not get the H1N1 Inactivated Influenza Vaccine, the “Flu Shot”?

1. People with a severe (life-threatening) allergy to eggs.
